

Community Garden sets up satellite location

The Livingston Community Garden began work at a satellite location Saturday, using the layout of professional and sustainable landscape designer Errol Schumann.

A dozen volunteers pulled up sod, added soil amendments and planted fruit trees and bushes in the yard surrounding the Western Sustainability Exchange's office at 215 S. Third St.

The development of the official site of the Community Gardens, located between Mountainview Cemetery and The Northern Lights subdivision, has been delayed due to negotiations with the City of Livingston.

The goal of the satellite location is to make 12 gardening plots available for com-

munity members to lease this season. The cost of each plot varies according to size but ranges from \$40 to \$90 and includes water usage, and gardening hoses and tools. A \$40 refundable deposit is required.

The Community Gardens received donations of seeds, seedlings and fertilizer, which will be made available to those leasing the plots.

The preparation of the plots will continue through Sunday, May 31, until the completion of Schumann's design for the area. Then the plots will be ready for gardeners to begin work.
